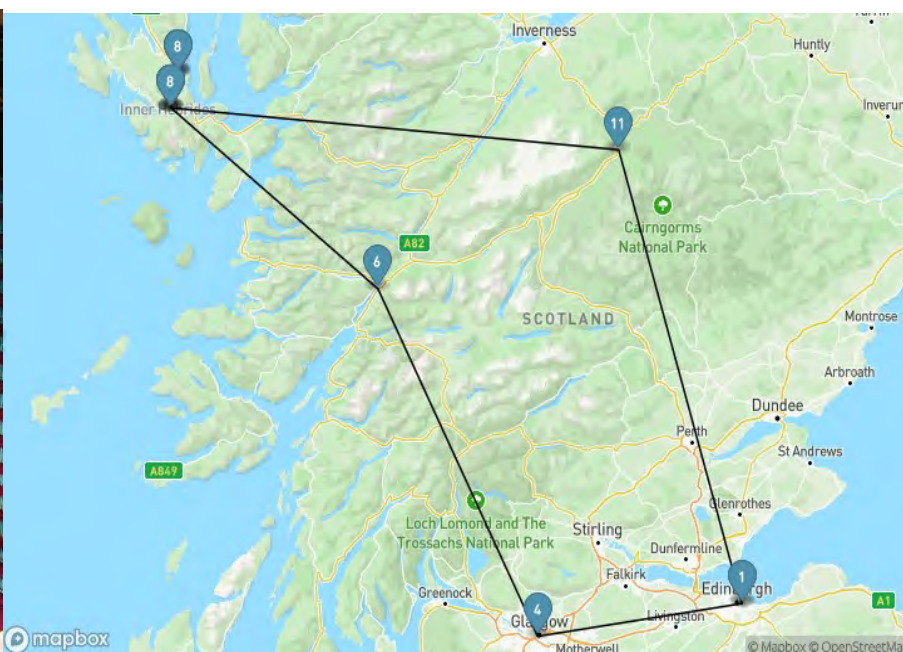

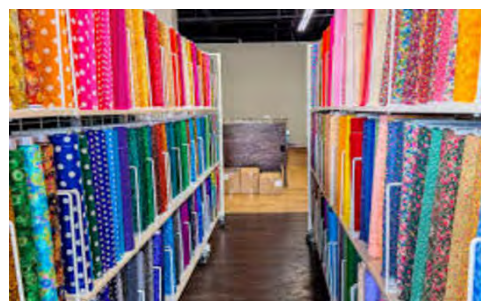


Day 4 – TUE, AUG 3, 2027 – EDINBURGH TO GLASGOW

Paired with fragrant loose-leaf teas — or elevated with a glass of Champagne, prosecco, or a carefully chosen dram — the atmosphere is calm, graceful, and unmistakably special. Finally, explore the Skye Shilasdair Shop and the Skye Weavers Workshop, where you can discover beautifully crafted woven products that reflect Skye's rich creative traditions.

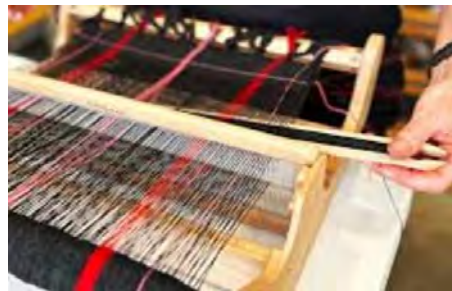


Day 11 – TUE, AUG 10, 2027 - ISLE OF SKYE TO AVIEMORE

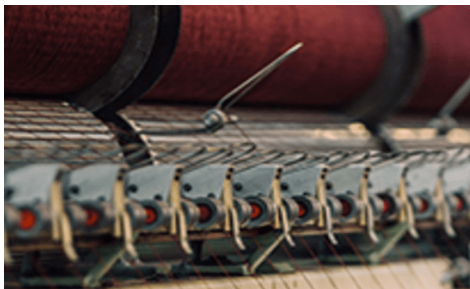


Day 12 – WED, AUG 11, 2027 – AVIMORE

A private transfer from Achnagairn Castle to Edinburgh with visits to Johnstons of Elgin and Verdant Works offers a relaxed and culturally rich journey through Scotland, combining comfortable door-to-door travel with two distinctive textile heritage experiences. Guests begin with a visit to Johnstons of Elgin to discover the artistry behind their world-renowned cashmere and wool production, with time to explore the mill and visitor centre.

Continuing to Dundee, guests visit Verdant Works, a beautifully preserved former jute mill that brings Dundee's industrial textile heritage to life and offers insight into the city's historic weaving and manufacturing industries. Enjoy a light lunch during the journey before continuing south to Edinburgh, creating a seamless blend of Scottish craftsmanship, industrial heritage, and scenic travel.

Spend time exploring the castle and its grand royal interiors before discovering more of Stirling's fascinating heritage. With your vehicle available for the day, there is also the opportunity to visit some of the area's other intriguing sites, including Mar's Wark, King's Knot, the Old Bridge, Cambuskenneth Abbey, Menstrie Castle, Dunblane Cathedral, or Doune Castle, famously associated with Game of Thrones and Outlander. You could also seek out the wonderfully eccentric Pineapple, set within one of the region's beautiful gardens.

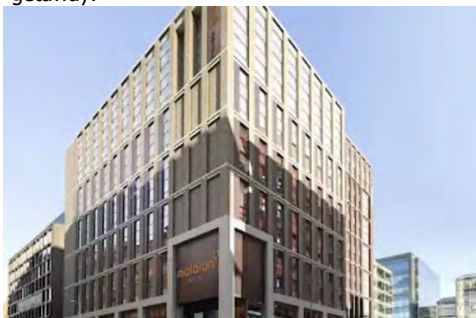
